

IMPORTANT!!!

Courses that are required for graduation/ current grade level will be automatically added to your student's schedule until a final transcript from the summer school institution confirms the completion of the course. Only after this is confirmed will the course be removed from the student's schedule. If the student wishes to take a different course in place of the one that was taken over the summer, a copy of the transcript or official notification from the summer school institution must be turned in to the student's School Counselor **NO LATER THAN AUGUST 8th**. Otherwise, the student will automatically be placed into a student study center.

If you are taking one of the seven courses below that require an end of course exam, you may test in July (week of July 23rd) or in December. Please contact Kelley Bloomer if you have signed up for one of these courses.

3) Upon completion of the course, make sure your transcript from the institution was sent to Big Walnut High School on or before August 8th.
