

Community/Habilitation Assistant Certificate Program Description (CHA)

The CHA program is a one year (summer term and two semesters) certificate program offered by Columbus State Community College for adults, of any age, that have a developmental disability. Students will take classes and participate in practicums that will teach them the skills needed to assist others in becoming more independent and social. Upon the successful completion of the program, students will be eligible for a position as a Community/Habilitation Assistant at a Human Service Agency.

CHA PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- o Have a developmental disability
- o Have a 5th grade or above reading level
- o Have the ability to "look outside of yourself"
- o Demonstrate interest in developing skills needed to assist others
- o Receive 3 recommendations to participate from past/current teachers, work study coordinators, employer, service coordinator, etc.
- Apply to Columbus State Community College, take the COMPASS placement test, complete and submit CHA application packet.
- o Participate in an interview with the Program Coordinator.
- O Submit most recent IEP and ETR
- Have a proven ability to participate appropriately in a classroom and/or professional work settings
- Meet Ohio's background check requirements to work with individuals with a developmental disability.

FEES

Fees for the CHA Program are tuition-based and follow the typical Columbus State fee schedule.

Transportation is the individual's responsibility.

Applications accepted anytime after November 1, 2014 until 14 applicants have been accepted. Program starts Summer term 2015.

What is this program about?

- 3 semester (Summer, Autumn and Spring) certificate program offered at Columbus State for adults of any age that have a developmental disability.
- Program is for individuals with a Developmental Disability that want to work with/support individuals with a Developmental Disability.

Who qualifies for the program?

- Individuals that:
 - > Have a developmental disability
 - Have a high school diploma or GED
 - > Have a 5th grade reading level (comprehension)
 - Have an interest in developing skills to assist others
 - > Have the ability to "look" outside of themselves
 - > Be willing to commit to going to school for one year.
 - Meet Ohio's background check requirements to work with individuals with a developmental disability.

Will they take classes at Columbus State?

 YES! This is a college based program. Classes are taught at Columbus State. Classes will be adapted to meet the learning styles and needs of students.



What kind of classes do students take?

- > 2 classes during the summer.
 - · College Success
 - Students learn the skills needed to be successful in this program, in college and in their future job.
 - Service Delivery and Ethics
 - This course prepares students for their practicum experience by reviewing clinical expectations, supervision, professionalism and ethics. Practicum sites are toured and discussed.

What about the other 2 semesters?

- Autumn Semester
 - > Introduction to Developmental Disabilities
 - Practicum & Seminar in Developmental Disabilities
- Spring Semester
 - > Intervention Strategies A
 - Practicum & Seminar in Intervention Strategies
 - > CPR

Schedule

- Students are at Columbus State's downtown campus one day per week
- Students are at their practicum 2-3 days per week.
 - > Students can be from Franklin and surrounding counties. Attempt is made to secure practicum sites close to the individuals home / within home county.

What is a practicum?

- In the Autumn and Spring semesters students complete a practicum at a local human service agency. Students spend 10.5 14 hours a week at their practicum learning and practicing skills that wilk help them become a community/habilitation assistant.
- Students typically complete their practicums at 2 agencies over the 2 semesters.
- A Liaison from Columbus State supports the student at their practicum by visiting them at the agency 3-4 times per semester. A teaching assistant is also available to provide supports throughout the semester as needed.

Transportation is the student's responsibility

- Some students have providers or parents that transport them, some drive, some take the City Bus, some walk.
- County Boards and OOD/BVR have also assisted.





Does this program cost Money?

- Yes.. The courses and practicums are Columbus Stàte classes. Students take 3-7 credit hours per semester.
- Total program cost is approximately \$2300.
- Students are encouraged to apply for financial aid and work with OOD/BVR.

Can students be involved in other ways at Columbus State

- Absolutely -Students can take additional classes – former students have taken CPR, Early childhood classes, resistance training, developmental writing
- Students have worked out in fitness center and join free fitness classes.
- Students have joined campus clubs/organizations.

Do Certified Community/Habilitation assistants get jobs?

- 6 Certified Assistants are working as Preschool assistants (Easter Seals / Dahlberg Learning Center)
- 3 Certified Assistants are working in County Board operated schools
- 2 Certified Assistants are working at Bixby Living Skills Center with individuals with severe and profound disabilities.
- 2 Certified Assistants are working at Hague Living Skills Center with individuals with severe and profound disabilities
- 1 Certified Assistant is working at a Day Program for Seniors. – Goodwill Columbus Young Adult Programs
- 4 Certified Assistants are working in a Day Habilitation
 Program –All R Friends

Jobs cont..

- 1 Certified Assistant works for ADD's Community Connection.
- 9 Certified Assistants work in Workshop settings doing a variety of jobs. Assisting in Hab. Rooms and on the work floor, Giving tours, facilitating self-determination activities, helping with bus duty, assisting in cafeteria, reading to individuals, etc.
- 1 Certified Assistant is working as a Personal Care Specialist at the Heinzerling Foundation
- 1 Certified Assistant is working for CORI-CARE
- 1 Certified Assistant is working for Columbus, Wellness Program

If someone completes the program and gets a job....

- It may be full-time or part-time.
- Wages will be decided by temployer.



How Do Students Apply?

- Schedule an interview with Jackie Teny-Miller (phone # 287-2544). Interviews can be scheduled from Dec.-February.
- Complete online application for CSCC.
- Take COMPASS test
- Complete CHA application packet
- Request letters of recommendation from 3 professionals
- Submit completed application and most recent IEP and ETR to Jackie Teny-Miller

Are students automatically accepted into the program?

 No...up to 14 students will be selected to participate in the program
